If your dog recently received the rabies vaccine, please come in with a copy of the rabies certificate so we can update your records.

Personnel Spotlight

Officer Chris Lind, Police Department, recently began a 16 week Police Academy program at the NH Police Standards & Training Council in Concord. Officer Lind

will receive classroom training in laws, ethics, report writing, human relations, and many other topics. In addition to receiving firearms training, he will also receive practical and scenario-based training on everything from traffic stops and defensive tactics to building searches. Upon successful completion of the program, Officer Lind will be certified by the Police Standards and Training Council as a full-time Police Officer.

Officer Tyler Coady, Police Department, recently completed a one week training course in rifle instruction at the Sig Arms Academy in Epping, NH. Officer Coady is now a certified instructor and is able to train the rest of the Department.
