Dear Community Members,

As we look forward to spring and warmer weather there will be more people out enjoying the fresh air, so we would like to take a moment to remind everyone to be cautious, whether driving, walking, jogging or cycling. Our goal is to simply make our streets safer for everyone! To help us achieve this goal, we will be utilizing grant funding from the NH Office of Highway Safety to increase random traffic enforcement patrols focusing on speeding, school bus violations, driving under the influence, stop sign violations and distracted driving.

On another note, I'm happy to share that our final Accreditation assessment with the NH Law Enforcement Accreditation Commission (NHLEAC) happened on February 12th, and it appears to have gone very well. We'll find out in March, after their next council meeting, if we've earned state accreditation. It's a big deal for us, and I'll keep you posted on the outcome. 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TASER 10 Training



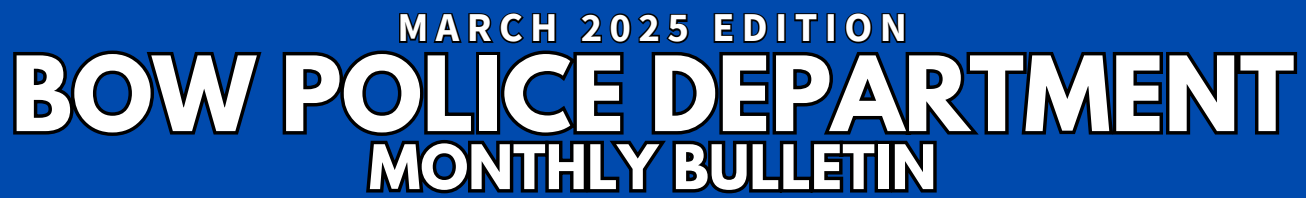
Lt. Lamy, Lt. Pratte, Sgt. Behning, and Sgt. Welch were certified by Axon to be instructors in the Taser 10 platform.

In February, the instructors hosted a training to certify all Bow Police officers as Taser 10 users. Training consisted of a classroom portion, live deployments on conductive targets, and scenario-based training. The instructors will conduct re-certification training with all officers annually.

On behalf of all the members of the Bow Police Department, we extend our deepest condolences to the family, friends, and co-workers of Concord Firefighter CJ Girard. You are all in our thoughts and prayers during this difficult time. CJ was a member of the Bow community and will be deeply missed by all who had the honor of knowing him.

From the Concord Fire Department:

It is with profound sadness that we report the death of active member Christopher "CJ" Girard. CJ passed unexpectedly at his home on Saturday evening after a brief illness. He was 39 years old.

CJ is a beloved husband and father of two young children, whose pride and commitment to his family was evident every shift. He has served the City of Concord for seven years and has previous affiliations with Londonderry Fire and Pease International Airport Fire.

CJ took immense pride in being on the top of his game. Whether it be his passion for the truck and joining the hazmat team like his father, or honing his EMS skills, or testing the hypothesis of the fastest and most efficient rescue techniques, he was constantly working on being the best firefighter he could be and held his peers to the same standard.

Our brothers and sisters are hurting today. While it was a long night, we are reminded of the resiliency of our union, our department, and the fire service family. We truly appreciate the outpouring of support during this challenging time. We especially want to thank the Bow Fire, Bow Police, Concord Police, New Hampshire State Police and the medical examiner's office for their professionalism and commitment for allowing us to honor and escort CJ as he deserved.

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JESSICA'S LAW NH RSA 265:79-b

265:79-b Negligent Driving. – Whoever upon any way drives a vehicle negligently or causes a vehicle to be driven negligently, as defined in RSA 626:2, II(d), or in a manner that endangers or is likely to endanger any person or property shall be guilty of a violation and shall be fined not less than \$250 nor more than \$500 for a first offense and not less than \$500 nor more than \$1,000 for a second or subsequent offense.





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BAC	Effects Experienced
.02-.04%	Lightheaded – Relaxation, sensation of warmth, “high,” minor impairment in judgment
.05-.07%	Buzzed – Relaxation, euphoria, lower inhibitions, minor impairment of reasoning and memory, exaggerated emotions (positive and negative)
.08-.10%	Legally impaired – Euphoria, fatigue, impairment in balance, speech, vision (particularly peripheral), reaction time, and hearing, judgment and self-control impaired
.11-.15%	Drunk – “High” is reduced, depressive effects (anxiety, depression, unease) more pronounced, gross motor impairment, judgment and perception severely impaired
.16-.19%	Very drunk – Strong state of depression, nausea, disorientation, dizziness, increased motor impairment, blurred vision, judgment further impaired
.20-.24%	Dazed and confused – Gross disorientation to time and place, increased nausea and vomiting, may need assistance to stand or walk, impervious to pain, blackout likely
.25-.30%	Stupor – All mental, physical, and sensory functions are severely impaired, accidents very likely, little comprehension, may pass out suddenly
.31% and up	Coma – Level of surgical amnesia, onset of coma, possibility of acute alcohol poisoning, death due to respiratory arrest likely in 50% of drinkers
