Chief's Message FROM CHIEF KEN MILLER



October is an incredibly busy month, marked by vibrant fall colors, cooler days, and increased community activities. While we celebrate the season, it also presents unique safety challenges. With shorter days and changing weather, roads can become unpredictable. We remind motorists to use caution driving as wet leaves can be as slippery as ice. Please reduce speed on curves and maintain a safe following distance. Moreover, visibility decreases rapidly with shorter days and fog. Using your headlights during dawn, dusk, and any periods of rain or fog can help you navigate safely.

Please remember to yield to school buses and pedestrians near crosswalks. In addition, sun glare can be a major issue this time of year. Also, the bright colors and piles of leaves can obscure pedestrians, signs, and cyclists. Slow down, especially on residential roads and remember this is peak season for deer activity, particularly at dusk and dawn.

October is also nationally recognized as Domestic Violence Awareness Month (DVAM). Our department is committed to supporting victims and survivors in our community. Domestic violence affects people from all backgrounds, and we encourage anyone who is experiencing abuse, or who knows someone who is, to reach out for help. Confidential resources are available locally and statewide, and our officers are trained to connect you with the support you need. If you or someone you know is in immediate danger, please call 911 or call our non-emergency line 603-223-3950 to find out about the resources that are available.

In recognition of Breast Cancer Awareness Month, our officers will proudly wear pink badges throughout October to honor those affected by breast cancer and support efforts for research and early detection.

Lastly, Halloween is fast approaching, trick or treating hours this year are from 5pm to 8pm on Friday October 31st. We look forward to a night of fun and safe trick-or-treating. Given the increased activity on Halloween, especially since the date falls on a Friday this year, please remember to make safety a top priority. Remind children to carry a flashlight, use glow sticks, or apply reflective tape to costumes to ensure children are highly visible to drivers. Trick or treaters should ensure costumes are properly sized to prevent trips and falls, and that any masks do not obstruct their vision. Also, remind children to look both ways before crossing any streets and for parents to check all treats for signs of tampering and discard anything that doesn't look or feel right. Have a safe and Happy Halloween!

The professionalism and diligence of our officers remain our top priority, and we thank you for your continued support and collaboration in keeping our community safe.

Law of the Month

NH RSA 265:A-2 (Driving While Intoxicated)

Did you know that there are several ways a DWI can be enhanced to a Misdemeanor A or Felony level offense?

A conviction for a first offense DWI holds strict penalties to include:

- Any person who is convicted of any offense under RSA 265-A:2, I shall be:
- Guilty of a class B misdemeanor;
- Fined not less than \$500;
- Referred by the court to an IDCMP and, if a first-time offender, required to submit to an alcohol and drug abuse screening within 14 days of conviction, and, if testing demonstrates the likelihood of a substance use disorder, to submit further to a full substance use disorder evaluation within 30 days of conviction, to be administered by a service provider indicated by the IDCMP, and thereafter to follow the service plan developed from that substance use disorder evaluation by the IDCMP;
- Required to complete a department of health and human services approved impaired driver education program prior to the restoration of the person's driver's license or privilege to drive;

What makes a DWI offense an Aggravated DWI offense?

While under the influence of an intoxicating liquor the driver:

- A blood alcohol concentration of .16 or greater
- Driving more than 30mph over the posted speed limit
- Causing serious bodily injury in a motor vehicle crash
- Eluding or attempting to elude a law enforcement officer
- Having a passenger under the age of 16 in the vehicle
- Driving the wrong way on a roadway (Effective January 1, 2026)



An Aggravated DWI conviction brings with it:

- Increased fines
- Mandatory jail time (minimum 5 days)
- Increased license suspension
- Installation of an interlock device
- Mandatory participation in IDCMP






