Law of the Month

NEW HAMPSHIRE STATE LAWS (RSA 265:144-A) REGARDING THESE MOTORIZED DEVICES, AS THE RULES DEPEND ENTIRELY ON HOW THE VEHICLE IS CLASSIFIED.

KNOW YOUR VEHICLE

- **ELECTRIC BICYCLES (E-BIKES): MOST E-BIKES (UNDER 750 WATTS) ARE TREATED LIKE REGULAR BICYCLES. THEY DO NOT REQUIRE REGISTRATION OR A LICENSE.**
- **CLASS 3 E-BIKES (UP TO 28 MPH ASSIST) MUST BE OPERATED BY SOMEONE 16 OR OLDER.**
- **HELMETS: LEGALLY REQUIRED FOR ALL RIDERS AND PASSENGERS UNDER 16 (CLASS 1/2) OR UNDER 18 (CLASS 3).**
- **E-SCOOTERS AND OVERPOWERED DEVICES: IF A DEVICE IS THROTTLE-ONLY, LACKS OPERATIONAL PEDALS, OR HAS A MOTOR OVER 750 WATTS, IT IS NOT AN E-BIKE. IT IS LEGALLY A MOTOR-DRIVEN CYCLE.**

RULES OF THE ROAD

EVERY RIDER IS AN OPERATOR OF A VEHICLE AND MUST OBEY ALL TRAFFIC LAWS:

- **STOP AT ALL STOP SIGNS AND RED LIGHTS.**
- **RIDE WITH THE FLOW OF TRAFFIC, NOT AGAINST IT.**
- **STAY RIGHT AS FAR AS SAFELY POSSIBLE.**

WE UNDERSTAND KIDS ARE OUT ENJOYING THE NICE WEATHER, BUT THE BEHAVIOR DESCRIBED (VEERING IN AND OUT OF LANES) BY SOME RESIDENTS IS DANGEROUS.

PLEASE REVIEW THE CLASSIFICATION AND SPEED OF YOUR CHILD'S MOTORIZED DEVICE AND ENSURE THEY KNOW AND ABIDE BY ALL TRAFFIC LAWS. THEIR SAFETY, AND THE SAFETY OF EVERYONE SHARING THE ROAD, DEPENDS ON IT.

THIS IS A BRIEF OVERVIEW OF THE LAW REGARDING E-BIKES FOR MORE INFORMATION ON E-BIKES PLEASE REVIEW NH RSA 265:144A.

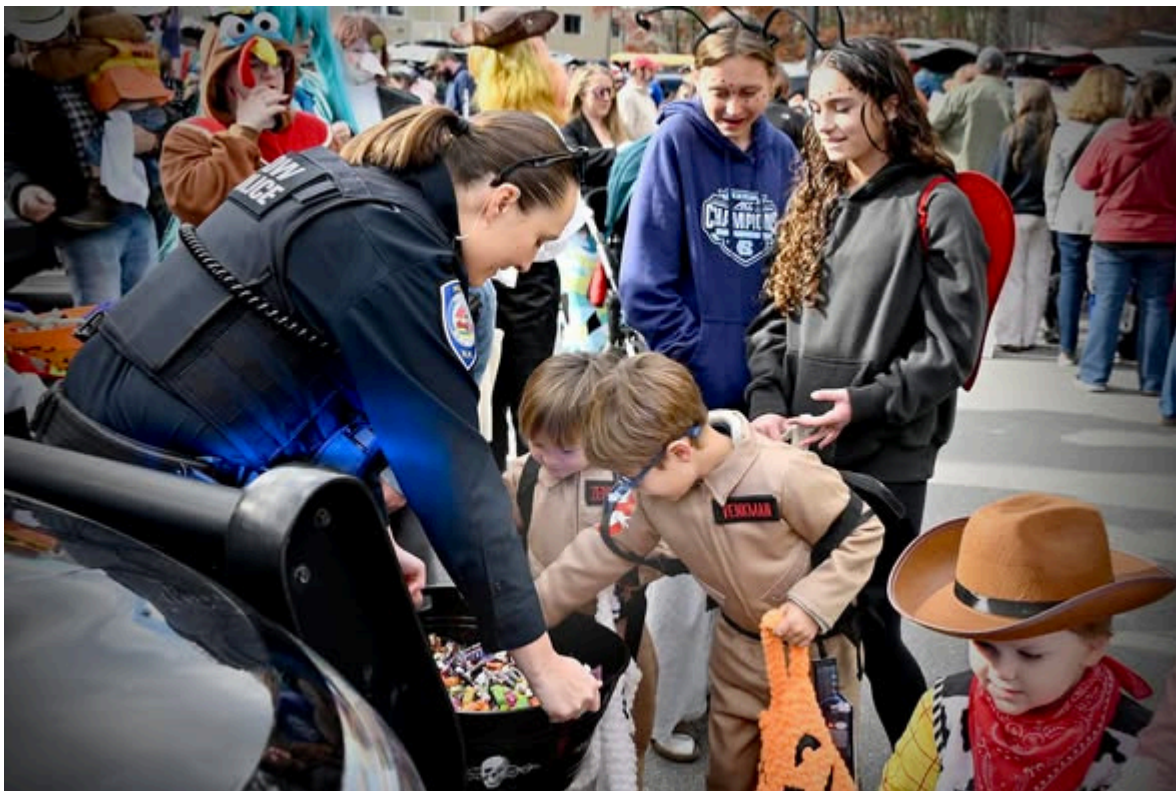

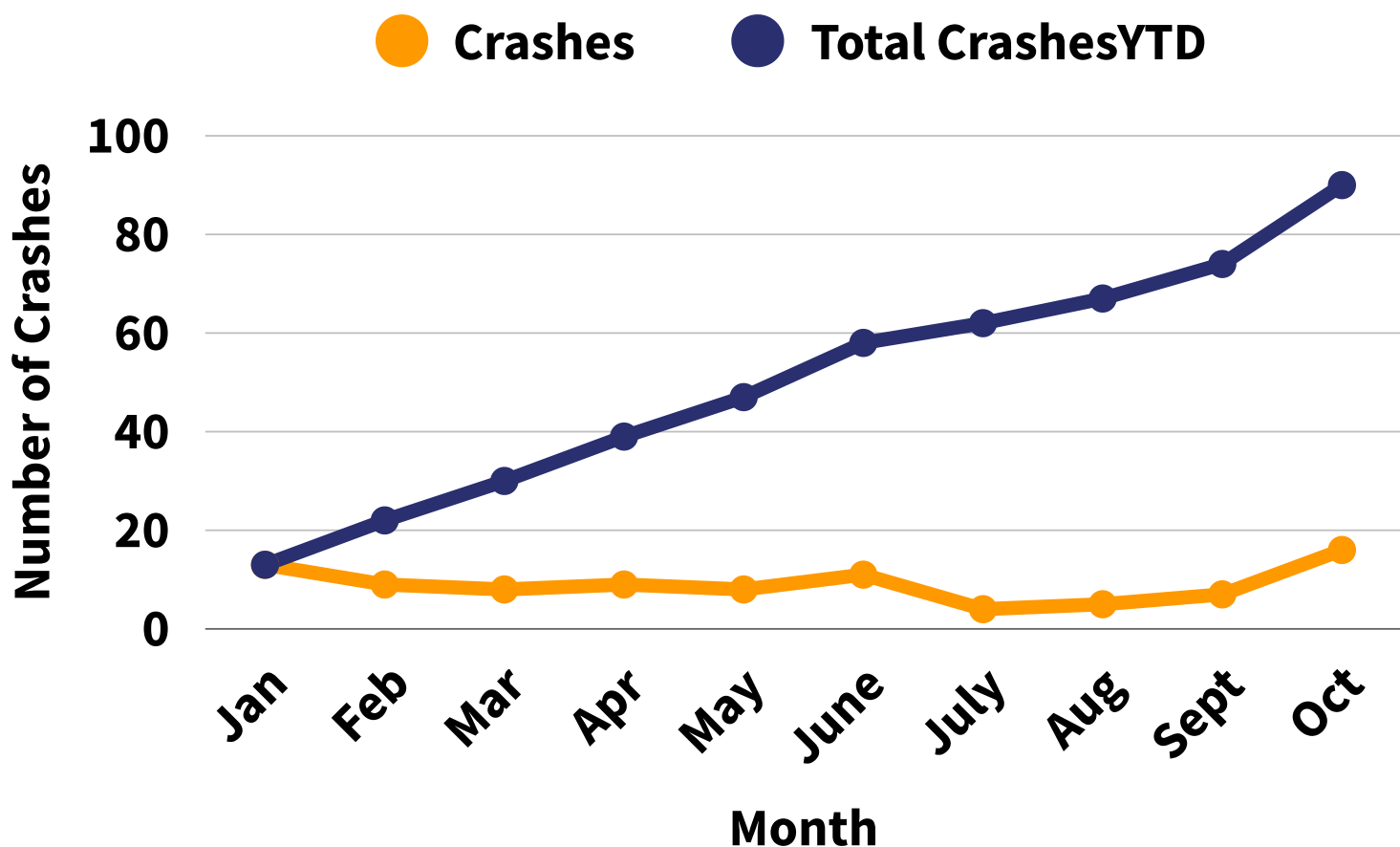
